Capital Campaign Launched for New Yardville CYO Pool House!

The Catholic Youth Organization (CYO) of Mercer County has announced their next major facility improvement project - to build a new pool house at our Yardville branch! The current pool house (which was constructed in 1958 by volunteers led by Monsignors Leonard Toomey and "Iron Mike" McCorristin) was demolished this past September after the current camp season was over. This 60 year old structure has been deemed inadequate for many years now because it is not handicapped accessible and relies on an antiquated septic system. Changing facilities offer little privacy and are quite overcrowded. Additionally, there is extremely limited bathroom / locker space for lifeguards and other camp staff. The new pool house will be a two-story structure (approximately 5,000 sq. feet). The first floor will include much larger changing areas for boys and girls (with several private changing stalls), restroom facilities and showers. The second floor will provide a staff bathroom / locker area along with a training / meeting room for CPR / First Aid classes, staff meetings, etc. The outside upper deck area will provide space for families to observe childen during evening swim lessons. The covered patio on the rear of the first floor will provide a shady area - easily accessible to campers in the central camp activity area. Lastly, the barbed wire fence surrounding the pool area will also be replaced! The goal is for this building to open in the Summer of 2020. This new pool house will provide more critically needed space for the CYO Summer Camp, evening swim lessons, and weekend rental groups. But it will also be a huge safety, security, aesthetic upgrade to the pool complex which is the crown jewel of the camp property - especially during our very busy Summer seasons.

EWING CYO PRE-SCHOOL BENEFITS FROM TCNJ GRANT TO CREATE CLASSROOM HYDROPONIC GARDENS

Once again, Ewing CYO Pre-School's Education Director, Pat Staltari, has succeeded in bringing a wonderful enrichment program to our classrooms through her ongoing collaboration with The College of New Jersey. This past summer. Pat began a dialogue with Dr. Louise Ammentorp, a professor at The College of New Jersey with specializations in Early Childhood Education and Environmental Studies, Dr. Ammentorp is especially interested in Environmental Sustainability. This is basically the study of how we can continue to sustain our planet in light of all of the challenges to the health of our environment that we face today. Dr. Ammentorp received a grant from the college for a sustainability project and she is using part of this grant to set up hydroponic gardens in Ewing CYO Pre-School's two classrooms for our oldest students.

Through this grant, our pre-school will receive two table top hydroponic gardens, the materials to seed and plant the gardens and assistance in setting them up. We will also receive children's books relating to gardens. Once the gardens are set up in the classrooms, each child will have the chance to plant a seed and watch it grow over time. Dr. Ammentorp will also provide training to our staff on how to use and maintain the gardens. In return for receiving these gardens, we have agreed to work collaboratively with Dr. Ammentorp by developing a curriculum and lesson plans that will be developmentally appropriate for pre-school children. Our teachers will also maintain continuous documentation on how the gardens are progressing. This project offers a wonderful opportunity for our children to experience hands-on STEM learning as well as a basic introduction to the science of Environmental Sustainability. We are scheduled to begin setting up our gardens this coming January. We sincerely thank Dr. Louise, TCNJ and Ms. Pat for providing this amazing learning experience for our children!
