

It's that time of year again, and so much is happening at Ewing CYO Pre-School @Hollowbrook! For starters, now that just about all of the COVID-19 restrictions have been lifted, families are once again permitted into our building and have the opportunity to witness firsthand all the wonderful things that are going on in our classrooms. In fact, for the first time since 2019, we held an in-person Back to School Night complete with babysitting and refreshments that was attended by approximately 90% of our families. This was probably our best turnout ever and we are so happy that our families are as excited about the new school year as we are! We also held our first field trip since 2019, taking the children to Johnson's Corner Farm in Medford, NJ for a morning of pumpkin picking, picnicking and feeding the animals. The weather could not have been better and everyone including children, staff and chaperones had a fantastic time. Activities such as monthly yoga sessions with Marsha Wiley and bi-weekly story times with Ms. Christine in the Hollowbrook Library took place throughout COVID-19 and will continue into this school year. Through the strong collaboration we have created with The College of New Jersey (thanks to the outreach efforts of our Education Director, Pat Staltari), we also have music students, nursing students and early childhood education students who provide enrichment activities and assistance in our classrooms. As in the past, we also have seniors from the Federal Foster Grandparent program (Americorp Seniors) and Pathstone who provide assistance and intergenerational experiences for our children. Finally, now that we've reached the fall season, it was time to harvest the crops from our playground garden. We grew strawberries, herbs, mint, cherry tomatoes, cucumbers and some huge sweet potatoes! It was probably the largest crop we ever produced! Thanks to our Pre-K teacher, Mrs. Biernet Sabree for taking such wonderful care of our garden over the summer! We are so glad to be back for another year of fun and learning at Ewing CYO Pre-School!
