CYO EWING

Spring is full of exciting happenings at Ewing CYO Preschool. For starters, through a wonderful collaboration with The College of New Jersey's Nursing Department, forged by our Education Director, Pat Staltari, we were able to have a group of nursing students, led by Professor Tami Jakubowski, come to our center to perform dental, hearing and vision screenings on our children. The Nursing students also held Teddy Bear Clinics at the center where each child was able to perform a physical examination on a stuffed animal of his or her choice and try out a real stethoscope. The purpose of this was to make a visit to the doctor just a little less scary for the children.

Also, just before COVID-19 forced us to close our doors in March 2020, Professor Louise Ammentorp, of The College of New Jersey's Department of Early Childhood Education, set up hydroponic gardens in two of our classrooms so the children could learn how plants can grow without soil. Naturally, when we closed, our gardens withered away but Professor Ammentorp has returned and is helping our staff set up the gardens once again. And, as an added bonus, a group of Professor Ammentorp's honor students held a fundraiser for our program and have purchased gardening equipment for use on our outdoor playground garden. These students also came to our center to help the staff get our garden ready for the spring and summer months. Furthermore, now that the Hollowbrook Library is open once

again, our classes have resumed visits with Librarian, Ms. Christine, for story time twice a month. The children are also enjoying yoga sessions once a month with Ms. Marsha Wiley.

Finally, on Monday, April 25, two groups of students from The Lawrenceville School came to our center to spruce up our playground and gardens for the warmer months ahead. Many thanks to the students and staff of The Lawrenceville School for helping us to complete this monumental task! In short, Ewing CYO Pre-School is slowly but surely emerging from the COVID-19 restrictions of the past two years and we look forward to further expansion of our activities as time goes on.
